The ASUM 24 Scientific Committee is pleased to invite presenters to submit the abstracts for oral and poster presentations to be delivered at the 2024 conference from 1-3 November at the W Hotel, Brisbane.

The ASUM meeting is conducted annually and always attracts a multi-disciplinary group of healthcare professionals from Australia, New Zealand and the surrounding Asia and Oceania region to discuss and explore the latest trends, research findings, and innovative solutions within the field of diagnostic ultrasound. The ASUM Board and ASUM 24 Scientific Committee greatly appreciate you taking the time to submit your work for consideration.

Ultrasound Excellence

The theme of ASUM 24 is, 'Ultrasound Excellence: Forging Connections, Enhancing Collaboration, Amplifying Communication'. The conference format intends to target key areas of ultrasound specialisation, while bringing together the various disciplines to share their intelligence.

Submission Guidelines

We welcome your submission but before commencing the submission process, please note:

- Online submission is the only method of abstract submission. Abstracts must be submitted via the EventsAir submission portal.
- Whilst you can return to your submission at any time (before the submission deadline ends), once you are finished with entering all the details, please ensure you proceed to the end to complete your submission. Only submitted abstracts will be reviewed.
- Please note the title must not be written in all caps, but in sentence case only.
- Abstracts submitted for presentation will be published exactly as received and should be checked for spelling and grammar prior to submission.
- It is the responsibility of the presenter / author to ensure that the abstract is submitted correctly. An automatic acknowledgment email will be sent once your abstract submission is complete.
- Abstracts are anonymously peer-reviewed and scored. Accepted abstracts are allocated on merit to conference sessions.
- You will receive a separate email confirmation for each submission that you make.
- Where there is more than one presenter all correspondence will be sent to the person who submitted the abstract. It is the submitting author's responsibility to ensure that all emails

to do with the abstract are passed on to the presenting author, and any other relevant parties.

- Every effort will be made to accommodate the presenter / author presentation preference however the Scientific Committee reserves the right to allocate the presentation to best suit the program.
- The invitation to submit an abstract does not constitute an offer to pay travel, accommodation or registration costs associated with the conference. Similarly, no presenter fee is paid to successful presenters.

Original research & proffered papers

Abstracts must:

- Not exceed 400 words, excluding the title, authors and institutions, including references (references not required for original research).
- Have a title less than 30 words. The title should be brief and explicit.
- Use abbreviations only for common terms. For uncommon terms, the abbreviation should be given in brackets after the full use of the word.

References

If including in-text references, these should follow the Vancouver style (i.e., numbered sequentially as they occur in the text and ordered numerically in the reference list).

Examples of referencing style:

- In-text referencing: "*Smith et al.*¹ discuss..."
- Citing a journal article: include the reference number, author name(s), paper title, abbreviated name of journal (in Italics), year of publication, volume number, first and last page numbers of material cited.

- Citing a book: include reference number, author name(s), title of chapter, editor name(s), title of book, city of publication, publisher, year of publication, first and last page numbers of material cited.
Eg. 2 Lovelock DJ. Radiation incidents in dentistry. In: Faulkner K, Harrison RM, editors. Radiation incidents. London: British Institute of Radiology; 1996. 6–11.
- Conference proceedings: include reference number, editor name(s), title of publication, title of meeting, date of meeting, city, country, publisher, year of publication.
Eg. 3 Ring EFJ, Elvins DM, Bhalla AK, editors. Current research in osteoporosis and bone mineral measurement IV. Proceedings of the 1996 Bath Conference on Osteoporosis and Bone Mineral Measurement; 1996 June 24–26. Bath. London: British Institute of Radiology; 1996.
- Conference paper: include author(s) and title of paper (as in the example above) followed by "In:" and the details of the conference proceedings in which it appears (as in the example above).
