



Biography: Dr. Madurangi Ariyasinghe Sri Lanka

Dr. Madurangi Ariyasinghe graduated from the University of Kelaniya, Sri Lanka with a Graduation Gold Medal for Academic Excellence in 2010. She obtained her MD - Emergency Medicine from the University of Colombo, Sri Lanka in 2017 as one of the first female postgraduate trainees of Emergency Medicine in Sri Lanka. She won the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine (ACEM) Foundation International Scholarship Award in 2018, the first Sri Lankan female emergency medicine trainee to win an international award. She got her overseas training in Ipswich General Hospital, QLD, Australia where she obtained her 2-year POCUS accredited training and international accreditation through POCUS Academy, USA. She is one of the first Emergency Physicians with international accreditation on emergency sonography in Sri Lanka. She is the co-founder of the EM



POCUS course and Founder of EM POCUS Academy established in 2022, the only Sri Lankan body providing and designing accredited training in emergency sonography and so far has trained more than 400 doctors on Emergency Sonography. She is a GIC Instructor for ERC, ELC, and APLS courses in local and international settings.

She is a Founder member of the Sri Lanka College of Emergency Physicians (SLCEP) and has held the post of Assistant Treasurer, Scientific Secretary and currently holds the post of chair of the Ultrasound chapter of SLCEP and the President-Elect of SLCEP for 2026. She was the chair of icEM POCUS 2023, the first International Conference on Emergency Point of Care Ultrasound in Sri Lanka. She has many international publications and is a co-author of Disaster Preparedness Prospectus for the National Hospital of Sri Lanka, Colombo. She is involved in developing strategic plans with the Ministry of Health, Sri Lanka including being a member of National Shared Care Cluster Development. She is a Member of the Royal College of Emergency Medicine and an Affiliated Member of the Australasian College for Emergency Medicine (ACEM). Her passion is advancing clinically oriented POCUS, research in PoCUS to standardise the emergency care system, and teaching.
