

Certificate in Clinician Performed Ultrasound (CCPU) Neonatal

Pathway for Existing Candidates

Background

With the introduction of the modular CCPU neonatal units, candidates who were enrolled prior to the launch of the new program will be transferred to the new CCPU modules at no extra cost.

What to do next?

- Choose to complete both cardiac and cranial or either, as a single unit.
- Nominate a CCPU appropriate primary clinical supervisor.
- Complete the online neonatal ultrasound modules and quizzes.
- Determine how many additional logbook scans you will need to record (see table below).
- Record logbook under supervision
- Ensure you have completed 2 formative and 1 summative assessment for each of the chosen units (if not already done).
- Submit logbook and the required number of complete ultrasound scans in DICOM format

How many scans are required?

- Candidates who have already recorded or submitted logbook scans for the legacy units can use these scans to meet the requirements of the new CCPU units.
- As well as meeting the required total number of scans for the new units, 50% of these need to be showing an abnormality or verified positive findings
- The number of additional scans may vary according to the proportion of positive versus normal scans previously recorded.
